GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. Age limit is 28 years for the Junior Project Fellow positions and 30 years for the Senior Project Fellow positions, but may be relaxed up to 5 years as per Government of India rules.
- 2. The candidate should report at Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Chandrabani, Dehradun, Uttarakhand, with original application and documents at 0900hrs on 1st May, 2018 for scrutiny of documents followed by Written Test and Interview on the same day at 1130 hrs onwards.
- 3. The Written Test will be based on general (English and Scientific logic) and subject (Ecology, Conservation and Wildlife Sciences) knowledge with 40 multiple choice objective questions of one mark each.
- 4. Application should be in the prescribed format, duly signed and should be accompanied by self attested copies of documents on educational qualifications, research experience, UGC/CSIR/GATE certificate (if any), extracurricular activities, date of birth, mark sheets of all examinations, community certificate (if sought relaxation as per Government of India rules), etc.
- 5. The Institute will not provide accommodation for candidates appearing for the interview. No TA/DA will be paid for attending the Interview.
- 6. At the time of the verification of original documents or even after selection, if it is found that an attempt has been made by the applicant to wilfully conceal, misrepresent or canvass the facts, such applicant will not be considered for selection and due action will be implemented.
