



Response: The details of wild elephants collared by Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun during the last five years is as follows:

S.No	State	Number of elephants
1	Chhattisgarh	Seven elephants were collared and in that one elephant was collared twice
2	Uttarakhand	Four elephants have been collared

**Question-2: Kindly furnish copy of investigation report for the wild animals death due to radio collars**

Response: There are no reported deaths of wild elephants due to radio collaring operations in the work carried out by Wildlife Institute of India in Chhattisgarh and Uttarakhand during the last five years (2017 – 2021)
