1. The different colours of the Indian Alexandrine parakeet, also known as the Alexandrine parrot found in India. Please provide the information region-wise in different parts of India.	1. The Indian Alexandrine Parakeet or the Alexandrine Parakeet <i>Psittacula eupatria</i> is one of the commonest parakeets found in the Indian region. The species occurs many parts of India, and has its distribution extending Pakistan, Nepal, Bhutan, Sri Lanka and then throughout southeast Asia. Across the distribution range of the species, five different subspecies have been identified plumage colouration, which is green. Though in captivity, through selective breeding a range of colour variants of this parakeet are known that includes Dark green, Grey green, Blue, Blue, Lutino, Lutino Grey green, Albino, Albino Grey, Fallow, Clearhead Fallow and Pied.
2. Certified copy of the documents mentioning the percentage of increase population of the Indian Alexandrine parakeet since the implication of the Wildlife Protection Act (1972)	2. The only known population assessment of Alexandrine Parakeet for the Indian region is that reported in the "State of India's Birds Report (2020)". Based from across India the population trend of the species over a period of last two decades has seen a moderate increase. Global range of the species, it is assessed as Near Threatened. It is a protected species in India and is listed under Schedule 1 of the Indian Wildlife Protection Act.


